242 trainings conducted

Naloxone Distribution Boxes

11 naloxone distro boxes

The ROOT+ team installed and stocked vending machines and newspaper boxes with free naloxone kits, fentanyl test strips and xylazine test strips.

Harm Reduction Distribution

ROOT+ distributed harm reduction supplies through their community education events, naloxone distro boxes, and ROOT+ clients.

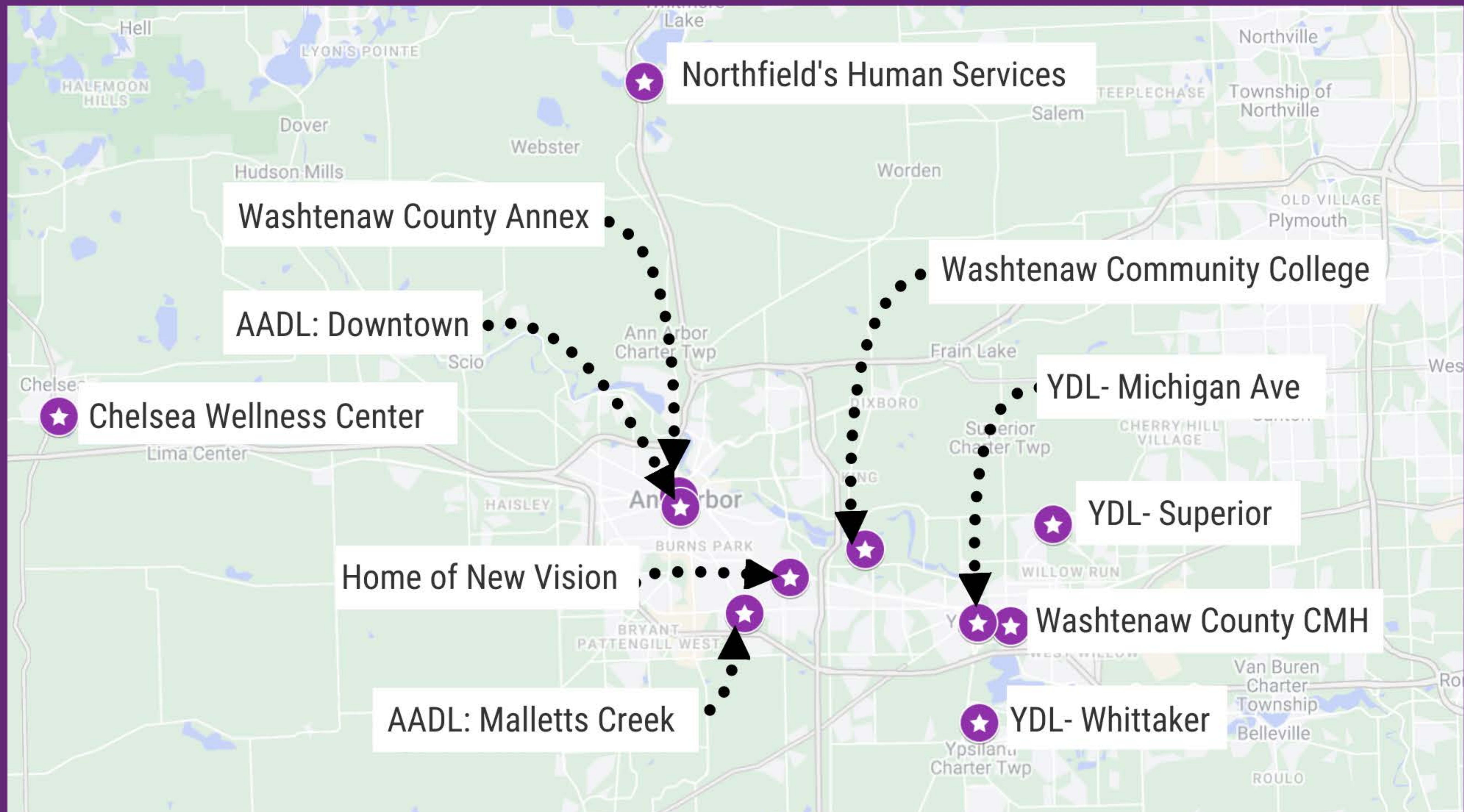

Naloxone Distribution Boxes



What is naloxone?

Naloxone (brand name Narcan) is a medication used to reverse an opioid overdose and prevent overdose death.

How to respond to an opioid overdose:

Take ACTION

- A** Arouse the person
- Apply sternal rub
- C** Check for signs of an opioid overdose
- Slow, irregular or no breathing
 - Blue, purple, or grey lips or fingernails
 - Unresponsive to pain (sternal rub)
- T** Telephone 911
- I** Intranasal/Intramuscular naloxone administration
- O** Oxygen
- Provide 2 rescue breaths and/or CPR
- N** Naloxone Again every 2-3 minutes until the person resumes breathing

Narcan Nasal Spray Instructions

1. Peel open the nasal spray package
2. Place the tip into the nostril



3. Push on the plunger to administer
